Revisions to the Statewide Minimum Shoreland Development Standards



After almost three years of work, by a dedicated Advisory Committee with over 25 members, the proposal to update the more than 35-year-old Shoreland Protection Program in Wisconsin has been sent to public hearings.

Wisconsin's Shoreland Protection Program, found in Chapter NR115 of Wisconsin Administrative Code, contains statewide minimum standards for shoreland development that are designed to protect water quality, fish and wildlife habitat and scenic beauty along navigable lakes and rivers.

The goal posed to the Advisory Committee was to protect public rights in navigable waters while allowing property owners the flexibility necessary to make reasonable use of their properties. This revision effort has been spurred by a continuing interest in waterfront building, new research about how such development affects water quality and fish and wildlife habitat, and growing complaints about the confusion of existing standards from property owners and local governments.

As in the past, each county in the state will continue to administer and enforce a county shoreland zoning ordinance that meets or exceeds the statewide minimum standards in Chapter NR115. Because a statewide administrative code cannot tailor make provisions to protect all resources equally, counties will continue to have the authority to create more protective standards that are better suited to local resource needs.

Public Hearings

The purpose of these hearings is to provide the public with another opportunity to review and comment on the proposal generated together by the Advisory Committee and the Department. The department gathered over 1300 comments from informal listening sessions held in November and December of 2003. Those comments, along with advisory committee comments, have been utilized to draft the public hearing proposal now out for review.

All Public hearings will begin at 4:30 and open with a short presentation from department staff and an opportunity for a question and answer session before formal public testimony is taken. It is important to allow the public to ask questions because zoning is a very complex issue. Please plan to attend the presentation session if you have outstanding questions or concerns before giving testimony.

The key to a successful Shoreland Protection Program is to find that proper balance between property owners' desires and the public's rights in Wisconsin's waters. We hope to achieve this goal through the progress that was made with the diverse Advisory Committee, by engaging the public early on in the process with informal listening sessions and the current public hearing process.
